

Kaleidoscope Kindergarten Porto Cristo, Mallorca, Spain

Kaleidoscope Kindergarten.

A transformation of a squash court in a kindergarten in Mallorca uses the traditional toy concept of the kaleidoscope. Variables such as natural light and children on the move generate a set of light reflections, constantly modifying the space and creating multiple worlds for interaction.

The kaleidoscopic structure has a hexagonal section that is 30 feet in length and six feet high, allowing children to walk inside and interact with the entirety of the space. The structure is characterized by a kaleidoscopic pink hue, a color of relaxed excitement, further contributing to the creation of this dream-like space. A random pattern of white circles of different sizes house various applications such as lighting, storage, slates, caches, and entries to other spaces.

Additional spaces such as a bath, staircase, the Magic Room, the Periscope, and the mezzanine respond to various sensory experiences playing with spaces, colors, reflections, textures, and fluorescence.
